The year 2011 in Review (Major Accomplishments)

1. We successfully executed the schoolbook project. 12,162 textbooks were donated to 96 schools. These books are valued at 29,238,442 FCFA.
We have successfully donated 34,725 textbooks to 110 schools worth 93,719,098 FCFA.
2. Pupils, teachers, parents and stakeholders in 81 primary schools were sensitized and educated on the causes and methods of preventing HIV/AIDS and Malaria.
3. The pilot project of Health clubs in primary schools was successfully launched this year in 20 primary schools. Health Clubs coordinators and representatives from all the clubs were trained on how to go about their activities. This project will be evaluated in February and the project extended to more schools on positive impact assessment.
4. Knowledge for Children together with the District Hospital in Nkambe commemorates the 23rd Anniversary of the International World AIDS day under the theme 'getting to Zero'. Health Clubs from all the 20 pilot project schools took part in the event
5. PTA presidents and their Assistants from 95 primary schools took part in one day capacity building seminar organized by KforC with technical assistant from the external services of the Ministry of Basic Education in Bui. Topics treated were, (a) the role of the PTA in primary Schools in Cameroon, (b) the importance of parent child communication and (c) a presentation on HIV/AIDS captioned 'what goes on behind close doors'.

6. Knowledge for Children recruited the third employee to the position of Program Assistant. He assumed duty on the 20/10/2011
7. The number of Zones were increased from 5 to 7 and 2 coordinators appointed to these honorary positions
8. A motor cycle was acquired to facilitate transportation to the field
9. AMI, one of our sponsors in Holland donated a laptop to our organization to facilitate the execution of our projects.
10. We succeeded in the April 2011 Global Giving open challenge by raising more than 4000USD from more than 50 different donors.
11. We emerged one of the winners of the Development Market Place Competition organized in Yaounde by the International Bank for reconstruction and Development (World Bank) and the Catholic Services. The Budget for this project was approved at 10,470,900 FCFA. This enabled us to add 15 schools to be benefiting from our programs.
12. Two of the beneficiary schools were adopted this year; CBCS Anseh by Rotary Wierden and GS Tengteng by Johan Friso. We now have a total of 7 schools adopted by companies in Holland.
13. One classroom was roofed this year in GS Mbah as a part of the pilot project Livebuild, a Dutch NGO working in partnership with Knowledge for Children.
14. Shisasay Foundation in Germany wrote a funding proposal on Structural Knowledge Exchange on behalf of Knowledge for Children and raised 15.000 Euro.
15. Knowledge for Children was represented at the launching of the 2011/2012 academic year and the visit of the Honorable Minister of Basic Education on invitation by the Regional Delegate of Basic Education for the North West Region. The contribution of Knowledge for Children to improve the quality of Education in the region was high recognized. We.
16. We received 1100 books pamphlets from the Himalayan Institute in Cameroon

17. Got affiliation to America Peace Corps. Knowledge for Children will be receiving placement from Peace Corps volunteer. Sadie Grossman now working permanently with knowledge for Children
18. We received technical cooperation and support from volunteers from Germany, America, Belgium and Holland;
